# Call of Meeting to Order

Mayor Cagas called the Regular Meeting to order at 7:35 p.m. The Clerk advised that this is a regular scheduled meeting of the Township Committee of South Hackensack. The date, time and location of this meeting has been advertised in the official newspapers of the Township, filed with the Township Clerk and posted on the bulletin board in the municipal building. All notice requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act for this meeting have been fulfilled. Mayor Cagas led the flag salute. The Municipal Clerk called the roll. All Committee members were present with the exception of Vincent Stefano.

# <u>Correpondence</u>

Eckel motioned; Brugger seconded to accept the <u>General Correspondence</u> for November and place them on file. All members present were in favor.

Brugger seconded; Eckel seconded to accept the <u>Monthly Department Reports</u> and place them on file. All members present were in favor.

Eckel motioned; Brugger seconded to accept the correspondence of Michael Ward, South Hackensack Ambulance Corps Chief, December 4, 2013- Use of Vehicle # 658 and place under new business. All members present were in favor.

Brugger motioned; Eckel seconded to accept the correspondence of Mary Terraccino, Tax Collector, December 5, 2013- Sundown Limited A/ Congello- Tax Credit and place under new business. All members present were in favor.

Eckel motioned; Brugger seconded to accept the correspondence of David V. Nasta, Esquire, December 9, 2013- Co- Location- Huyler Street Cell Tower and place under new business. All members present were in favor.

Bruger motioned; Eckel seconded to accept the correspondence of Ptl. Robert Chinchar-Memo to Captain Joseph Terraccino, December 9, 2013- Recommendation for alternate crossing guard-William Heinzelman, Jr. and place under new business. All members present were in favor.

Eckel motioned; Brugger seconded to accept the correspondence of Richard Napolitano, December 11, 2013- 30 Calicooneck Road Sewer and place under new business. All members present were in favor.

# Old Business

<u>Department of Public Works Proficiency and Evaluation</u>- Moonachie Update – Frank Cagas met with Mayor Vaccaro to discuss cost and snow plowing.

<u>Recycling Agreement</u> – David Nasta is in the process of preparing the bid/specifications with the removal of the barrels and should have something at next week's meeting.

<u>Patrolperson hiring</u> – The committee had reviewed the applications and feel that there are 15 potential candidates for interview. Capt. Terraccino informed the Committee on the Jan 3<sup>rd</sup> deadline for physicals and drug testing and Jan 24<sup>th</sup> would be the start of the academy. Frank and Vinnie are on the subcommittee and should meet ASAP to arraign interviews. Captain Terraccino will do initial background checks on the list of candidates before the interview process.

<u>Economic Development Study</u> – Nasta reported that he spoke with Vinnie on this and that financing, budget and funding has to be reviewed by the CFO Chris Eilert who is on vacation this week.

<u>Quality of Life Park Committee</u> — Vinnie is working on establishing a group of people for this committee

<u>Fire Alarm System for Municipal Hall</u> – This matter will have to be reviewed by the Plumbing Inspector Charlie Flenner when he returns to work.

<u>Mobile Vender proposed new ordinance</u> — with the suggestions from the health inspector this new ordinance will be introduced in January.

# New Business

Tax Credit for <u>Sundown Limited</u>- 57 Leuning Street – the tax collector Mary Terraccino explained the reason for the credit and is explained in Resolution No. 2013-189

<u>2014 Web Hosting</u> and Content Maintenance Agreement (no price increase for 2014) Mary Terraccino explained that there was no agreement on file and that if we were going to continue to use Kevin Kopec as the Web Host that the Township Committee should have an

agreement with terms and prices. Gary informed Donna to place on the agenda for the Re-Org meeting.

<u>Construction Code & Sub-Code Official</u> open position- Personnel Committee Update- Walter Eckel indicated that the interviews were held this week - and there will be further discussion on salary/ hours. Walter thanked Ray for his assistance and also to Len Falato for helping the town out to fill the void.

Mike Ward – Amb Corp Vehicle#658 – Gary reported that this car used to be the first responder car at the scene that is no longer being used. Mike Ward requested this vehicle for OEM purposes. This vehicle should be utilized and not just left unused in the parking lot. Frank Cagas inquired if the Fire Chief needed a vehicle and this car would be further discussed.

<u>Cell Tower – CoLocator Huyler Street</u> – DVN issued an opinion with regards to the Zoning Officers issue – DVN stated cell towers are preempted by Federal and State guidelines – the Planning Board did a review a few years back – Ray asked about side yard and bulk variance – and DVN indicated thatyou can't have a variance if you don't have a bulk schedule This matter will move forward as planned.

Robert Chinchar Crossing Guard – GB motioned; Walter Eckel seconded to hire William Heinzelman, Jr. as alternate Crossing Guard.

<u>Richard Napolitano – 30 Calicooneck Road Sewer Line</u> – Mr. Napolitano explained the situation. Frank Cagas suggested calling United Water to move the line for the fire hydrant. Mr. Napolitano submitted pictures taken to explain and Frank said he would have our Pluming Inspector Charlie Flenner review this matter.

She later questioned the property on 25 Grove Street — water retentions were installed and she still had concern about the sewer line that runs along that property and she still has concerns with the old clay sewer pipes along Huyler Street.

Michael Nasta — The Fire Chief's vehicle needs to be replaced because it's been through a few storms and floods —he indicated the Fire Dept could really use Vehicle #658 —years ago the Fire Dept used to have 2 cars one for the Chief and one for the Deputy Chief. Police Chief Terraccino indicated that every department could find a use for this vehicle — it has 57,000 miles on it. Frank and Gary will be on the subcommittee to discuss the options for this vehicle.

Lonnie Bedell-51 Grove Street – Complimented Captain Terraccino and his department for snow removal along with all the DPW workers.

At 8:31 Brugger motioned and Eckel seconded to go into Closed Session. All members present were in favor. DVN indicated that there is a few open session items after closed session. ## Resolution Authorizing Executive Session- December 12, 2013

A Resolution Providing for a Meeting Not Open to the Public in Accordance with the Provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4–12.

Whereas, the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A.* 10:4–12, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution, and

Whereas, it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4—12b and designated below:

- (1) Matters Required by Law to be Confidential: Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.
- (2) Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.
- \_\_\_\_\_(3) Matters Involving Individual Privacy: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the

individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.

XX\_(4) Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.

#### PBA Negotiations Update DPW Personnel

- (5) Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.
- XX (6) Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.
- XX (7) Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is require in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.

that the bidder was qualified and compliant with the terms of the bid specification and that it submitted the highest and best offer for the lease of the aforementioned lands and co-location on the aforementioned monopole and as a resulted awarded the aforementioned lease to SMSA Limited Partnership d/b/a Verizon Wireless .

South Hackensack, which are presently pending in the Tax Court; and

WHEREAS, it is has been recommended by the Tax Appeal Attorney, the Township Appraiser and the Township Assessor that the matters be settled at this time, and that such settlement is in the best interests of the Township;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack that the Tax Appeal Attorney be and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute any and all documents necessary in order to finalize the settlement of litigation entitled Philbern LLC vs. Township of South Hackensack, so that for tax year 2010, the assessment of \$821,000 will be reduced to \$775,000, resulting in a refund of \$992; for tax year 2011, the assessment of \$821,000 will be reduced to \$750,000, resulting in a refund of \$1,553; for tax year 2012, the assessment of \$821,000 will be reduced to \$750,000, resulting in a refund of \$1,619, and for tax year 2013, the assessment of \$821,000 will be reduced to \$725,000, resulting in a refund of \$2,265; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the aforesaid settlement is predicated upon a waiver of any and all pre-judgment interest by the taxpayer, as long as the refunds are paid within 60 days of the Township's tax refund bonding.

#### **RESOLUTION NO.-2013-195**

Resolution Re: Emergency Appropriation – Liability Insurance – Insurance Settlements

WHEREAS, an emergency has arisen with respect to liability insurance – insurance settlements and, no adequate provision was made in the 2013 budget for the aforesaid purpose, and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-46 provides for the creation of an emergency appropriation for the purpose mentioned above, and

WHEREAS, the total amount of the emergency appropriations created including the appropriation to be created by this resolution is \$ 55,472 and three (3) percent of the total operating appropriations in the budget for the year 2013 is \$221,524 and

Dear Mr. Eckel:

I would like to report on some of our accomplishments for the month of November. Checked & cleaned Ejector Station on Grove Street (daily), checked & cleaned Flood Pumps Rt. 46 & Huyler Street (daily), checked & cleaned Ejector Station in Garfield Park (3 times a week), daily check of all sewer lines in both sections of town. Swept all streets in this section of town, Moonachie & Garfield Park. Cleaned up town hall & senior's room. Cleaned up leaves along Phillips Ave, Town Hall and both monuments. Picked up bags of leaves, and took loads of leaves to dumps and put up Christmas lights around town hall and tree.

For the month of November, the Department Of Public Works had 2 pick up days for newspaper, November 12th. & November 26<sup>th</sup>. On November 12Th. the Department Of Public Works used 3 men, 2 trucks, 22 man-hours, 12 gallons of gas, and both trucks rode a total of 151 miles for a total of 9,360 pounds of paper. On the second pick up day, Nov. 26th, the Department used a total of 4 men, 2 trucks, 18 man hours, 15 gallons of gas, and both trucks rode a total of 121 miles for a total of 6,880 pounds of paper. Since this vehicle has been assigned several officers have taken it and other members to pick up equipment & other items, and ambulance 657 the oldest in the fleet has not been utilized. The crew on duty or officer as in the past can use ambulance 657 to pick up equipment or if the other ambulance goes on a call they can also look and pick up equipment.

I have been a life-long resident (60+) years at this address and am experiencing a sewer issue which I feel was caused by improper inspection and approval by the township.

In April 2008, we received a permit from the township to replace our sewer line to the main connection in the street (Permit # 08-046, copy attached).

Our plumber used for this project was, All Week Pluming of Garfield, NJ, lic. No 8706.

Before completing the connection to the main sewer line he brought an issue to the attention of the township concerning pitch.

Our sewer line as it nears the street is diverted by the feed line of the township fire hydrant which is quite unusually, located on our property?

This results in throwing off the pitch of our pipe resulting in a pocket or low spot that is consistently full of water which causes back-ups.

On 12/19/13, we had a back-up caused by the "back-pitched/not properly pitched line". We hired Cobra Plumbing of Little Falls to snake it out and to also make a video for us to record this issue, which we gave to the township DPW for review.

Our plumber will not even guarantee his work due to the nature of the problem and it is frankly an unnervingly and stressful situation in never knowing when we might encounter another back-up.

I was always under the impression that township inspector's responsibility was to ensure that code was met and the homeowner was protected through his inspection.

As we feel this issue was caused by the improper inspection, we respectfully request that the pipe be corrected and compensation granted for this recent bill.

Dear Ray:

Thank you for seeking my assistance in analyzing Verizon Wireless's request for a Zoning Certificate of Compliance with regard to its proposed co-location on the Huyler Street Monopole. This shall confirm the oral opinion rendered at the Regular Meeting of the Governing Body on Thursday, December 5, 2013 that the Township is free to issue a zoning certificate and process the filed building permit applications. The following are the reasons for my conclusion:

- 1. The property in question, Block 33.02, Lot 12.04, is owned by the Township of South Hackensack, is irregular in shape and is located in the "C" Industrial Zone adjacent to two developed industrial parcels and fronting county road, Huyler Street.
- 2. In accordance with a solicitation of bids the Township previously awarded a bid for the erection of a monopole at said site to T-Mobile Wireless. T-Mobile, in accordance with those bid specification made formal application to the South Hackensack Planning Board for review for **health and safety** reasons. As a result of said review site plan approval was granted. The Township thereafter entered into a lease with T-Mobile (assigned to Crown).
- 3. The proofs at the site plan hearing reveal that T-Mobile proposed a monopole which included the eventual co-location of one additional user. The Planning Board had adequate opportunity to review the health and safety aspects of any future co-location at that hearing. Similar inquiry on this application reveals no new issues in this regard.
- 4. Perhaps of greatest significance is a review of our municipal ordinance 208 (Article XI) Secs 55-57. Said ordinance restricts the "use" of property for monopoles to land owned by the Township. Of course the Township owns land in every zone within its borders. Most importantly a review of the aforementioned ordinance further reveals the following critical point; no bulk schedule. Of equal importance is that said specific ordinance does not require reference to the bulk schedule of a particular zone either. As such there is no bulk schedule review required or more importantly permissible. Your office and the Township is constrained to the dictates of our ordinance. The lack of a bulk schedule is consistent with the Township's desire to restrict monopole review to health and safety reasons and to defer to pre-emptive state and federal law. Again, the Township conducted the health and safety review during T-Mobile's site plan application. The use is permitted and there is no expansion of the same as the proofs were clear at the time of initial review that co-location (including the required equipment) was anticipated.
- 5. Finally, N.J.S.A. 40:55D-46 and 46.2 and Section 6409 of the Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act of 2012 (state and federal law respectively) carve out a clear exemption

to our Municipal Land Use Law site plan requirements. Equally clear is the definition under the state law which includes "equipment shelters, cabinets and emergency generators..." is items exempted from site plan review.

As a result of the foregoing it is clear that Verizon is not required to seek site plan review (as our ordinance requirement is now pre-empted) for its proposed co-location on the Huyler Street monopole and it is equally clear that our applicable municipal ordinance does not provide for or permit bulk schedule review and as a result bulk variance relief for the same. In fact, Sec 208-55B states that, "The Township of South Hackensack must consent to property being used for communications facilities".

Your usual thoroughness has ensured that the Township has adequately reviewed this matter and come to the proper conclusion. Please feel free to issue the certificate of zoning compliance and so advise the building department that they are free to process the filed building permit applications. Of course Verizon continues to remain liable to obtain all required permits and pass all inspections If you have any questions please feel free to call me.
