Call of Meeting to Order

Mayor Cagas called the Regular Meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. The Clerk advised that this is a special meeting of the Township Committee of South Hackensack. The date, time and location of this meeting has been advertised in the official newspapers of the Township, filed with the Township Clerk and posted on the bulletin board in the municipal building. All notice requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act for this meeting have been fulfilled. Mayor Cagas led the flag salute. The Municipal Clerk called the roll. All members are present.

Awards & Special Presentations

Little Ferry-South Hackensack- 11-12 Division and Regional Champion Bill Regan congratulated all the girls for a great season and each one of them were presented with a trophy and pictures were taken of the group with the committee members. Mayor Cagas praised the girls for doing an outstanding job.

National Night Out Presentations by Chief Michael D. Frew Michael Frew presented plaques to Robert Fox from Crazy Roni's and Vinko Astalkoski from Alan Party Rental for their generosity and donations that were provided to the town for the function of National Night Out that is held the first Tuesday of August every year. All of their donations were much appreciated.

Mayor's Award Presented to: *Brian Smith* – there was a fire call and Brian Smith was not present at this time.

Correspondence

<u>General Correspondence – August 2013</u> – Brugger motioned; Eckel seconded to accept the general correspondence and place them on file. All present were in favor.

<u>Monthly Department Reports</u> –Eckel motioned; Regan seconded to accept the monthly department reports and place them on file. All present were in favor.

NJDOT, September 4, 2013- Maintenance Roadway Repair- Route 80 Local East Bound and West Bound for 2014- Map Attached – Brugger motioned; Eckel seconded to accept this letter and place it on file. All present were in favor. Mayor Brugger informed the public that this repair would be to repave both of the ramps that go over Route 80 in town.

<u>Sgt. John Rizer, September 9, 2013</u>- Notice of Retirement-Brugger motioned; Regan seconded to accept this retirement letter with regret. All present were in favor.

<u>Larry Paladino, Jr, September 10, 2013-</u> Zoning Board letter of Interest – Regan motioned; Eckel seconded to move this to New Business. All present were in favor.

<u>Ashley Morrone, September 10, 2013-</u> Government Finance Officers Association Request – Brugger motioned; Regan seconded to accept this letter and place under new business. All present were in favor.

<u>Larry Paladino</u>, Jr, September 10, 2013- Tree Trimming and Removal Request – Eckel motioned; Regan seconded to discuss this under new business. All present were in favor. <u>Lydia Heinzelman</u>, <u>Technical Assistant</u>, <u>August 28, 2013-</u> Update of Building Department Permits –Brugger motioned; Eckel seconded to accept this letter and place it on file. All present were in favor.

Old Business

NJDOT Local Aid Grant application- Authorize Boswell Engineering to proceed with application at no charge – Brugger reported that the town has applied for Wesley Street several times and was rejected. Boswell said that they would submit the application for one more year without charge to the town.

<u>Department of Public Works Proficiency and Evaluation</u> – Nasta reported that the sub-committee met with regards to sharing of equipment and services with Moonachie. Frank suggested that both towns are in need of equipment to purchase and share and that we move forward with such an agreement. Brugger suggested this was a good idea.

<u>Greensky</u> – Joe Marrella received 3 proposals from different companies. This would be for our receiver of recyclables and the length of the contract was discussed. Nasta reported that a longer term of contract is a good idea with the prices and market standards. It would be great if garbage and recycle contract would start/stop at the same time. Suggestion was made for a 5 year term. Brugger motioned; Regan seconded to direct David Nasta draw up an agreement with Greensky and to authorize the Mayor to sign said agreement.. All present were in favor.

<u>CDBG 2013</u> – Brugger reported that this is the repaving street of Franklin Street. Bid specs will be drawn up with a cost estimate.

<u>CDBG 2014</u> – Frank was at the meeting at the County This is a new application that is due December 3, 2013 which can be submitted electronically.

<u>Sunesys</u> – Nasta reported that he reviewed this telecommunications contract. He said the committee is free to authorize said contract. Brugger motioned; Regan seconded to authorize said contract. All present were in favor.

New Business

Shared services with Memorial School and Township of South Hackensack for Comfort Station—South Hackensack Residents Only — Nasta reported that this contract has a term of 10 years with the principal of the school having discretion. Nasta believes that it should be Mayor, Police Chief or OEM manager. Stefano reported that he discussed this with Greg Maceri and Maceri agrees that it should be someone else along with a custodian to make a command decision and have the school opened by a custodian.

<u>Larry Paladino</u>, <u>Jr.</u>, <u>September 10, 2013-</u> Brugger motioned; Regan seconded to appoint Larry Paladino to the Zoning Board as an Alternate Member and to move the existing alternate member to fill the vacancy of regular member Fred Hum. All present were in favor and Stefano abstained.

<u>Ashley Morrone, September 10, 2013</u> – Stefano motioned; Regan seconded to authorize Ashley to attend the GFOA conference that provides classes that would be helpful for her position in the finance office. All present were in favor.

<u>Larry Paladino</u>, <u>Jr</u>, <u>September 10</u>, <u>2013</u> – Tree Trimming -Eckel reported on this issue that is on the corner of Maple and Grove Street. Joe Marrella reported to the committee. Discussion on stump grinding and tree removal along with pedestrian safety. Eckel wants the tree across from his house on Phillips Avenue inspected as well. Trees that are taken down will be replaced, but not planted under any wires. PSEG chops them up too much.

Brugger motioned; Cagas seconded to approved the proposal for R&P Landscaping at a cost not to exceed \$1320. All present were in favor – Stefano abstained.

<u>BRIAN SMITH PRESENTATION</u> – Mayor's award was presented to Brian Smith and he was congratulated for his dedicated services.

Resolution Authorizing Executive Session-September 12, 2013

A Resolution Providing for a Meeting Not Open to the Public in Accordance with the Provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4–12.

Whereas, the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack is subject to certain requirements of the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A.* 10:4–6, et seq., and

Whereas, the *Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A.* 10:4–12, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution, and

Whereas, it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4–12b and designated below:

- (1) Matters Required by Law to be Confidential: Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.
- (2) Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.
- (3) Matters Involving Individual Privacy: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.
- XX (4) Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.

PBA Negotiations Update

- (5) Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.
- XX (6) Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.
- XX (7) Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is require in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.

XX (8) Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.

Dear Mr. Eckel:

I would like to report on some of our accomplishments for the month of August. Checked & cleaned Ejector Station on Grove Street (daily), checked & cleaned Flood Pumps Rt. 46 & Huyler Street (daily), checked & cleaned Ejector Station in Garfield Park (3 times a week), daily check of all sewer lines in both sections of town. Swept all streets. Cut grass down park, behind school, along Phillips Ave, Town Hall, triangle on the bottom of Phillips Ave ramp, around sign on Phillips Ave, island on Lincoln Street. Clean ditch on Green St. Spread 3.21 tons of asphalt. Clean both ramps, and trimmed all bushes by VFW and Fire monuments.

For the month of August, the Department Of Public Works had 2 pick up days for newspaper, August 13 Th. and August 27 Th. On August 13 Th. the Department Of Public Works used 4 men, 2 trucks, 24 man hours, 12 gallons of gas, and both trucks rode a total of 124 miles for a total of 8,880 pounds of paper. On the second pick up day, August 27th, the Department used a total of 3 men, 2 trucks, 18 man hours, 12 gallons of gas; and both trucks rode a total of 111 miles for a total of 5,700 pounds of paper. For the month of August, the Department Of Public Works picked up a total of 14,580 pounds of paper.

For the month of August, the Department Of Public Works answered 12 ambulance calls. All 12 calls were medical emergencies. 7 calls were transported to Hackensack Medical Center, 2 calls were transported to Holy Name Hospital in Teaneck, 2 calls party refused aid, and 1 call was transported to Bergen regional Hospital in Paramus. The total manhours used for the month of August were 9 hours and 45 mins.
