Call of Meeting to Order

Gary Brugger reported that he will meet next week with fire company officers and discuss their inquiry regarding a rent increase to the department for the fire trucks. There was a discussion about the ambulance ceiling and a leak. H. J. Riley will look into it and report back to the Committee.

Dolly Montenegro, 57 Phillips Avenue – Reported that the Senior Citizen Club had a luncheon the day before, and had a mind reader for entertainment.

Michael Nasta, Kinzley Street – Wanted to know when the police were going to ticket drivers who go through the intersection at Phillips Avenue and Vreeland Avenue. He reported that a black card went through the intersection and he followed it and then reported it to the police who did nothing about it.

- (2) Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.
- (3) Matters Involving Individual Privacy: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.
- (4) Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.
- (5) Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.
- (6) Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.
- X_ (7) Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is require in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.

- (8) Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.
- _(9) Matters relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty: Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

Dear Mayor Eckel, Jr.,

I am writing to you to enlist your support in an effort to restore equity into the distribution of state aid to schools across the State of New Jersey.

During my years of service as a legislator, I have devoted significant effort to unraveling the mystery that surrounds our current school funding formula; a complicated formula that has been mandated by unelected judges authoring court decisions that have resulted in outlandish funding schemes that defy common sense.

Your school district is one of the many that are unfairly treated by the State when school aid dollars are appropriated. I have determined that your town only gets back \$0.06 for each dollar it sends to Trenton.

Let's be clear, our State Constitution mandates the progressive collection of taxes for property tax relief, and also provides for the distribution of school aid for the "equal benefit of all of the people of the State." The Constitution also states that "the Legislature shall provide for the maintenance and support of a thorough and efficient system of free public schools." Note that it says the Legislature, not the Court.

I have researched our income tax revenue projections for next year and have found that if those revenues were distributed equally to each student, it would equate to \$7,481.00 per student. Your town currently receives \$71,530.00 in state aid. Given your student enrollment projections, adoption of my plan would result in an increase in state school aid for your school district of \$2,349,034.00 annually. This change would provide meaningful property tax relief for your town now.

I have introduced fair school funding legislation that will comply with the mandates of our Constitution, and I need your help to get it passed into law.

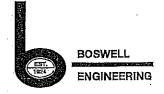

THE FOLLOWING IS WHAT HAS TRANSPIRED WITH THE OFFICE OF EMERGNCY MANAGEMENT FOR THE.

This year has been quite busy. We had a total of 10 incidents totally 117 Hrs, incidents were 1 Fire, 1 Hazardous Materials, 1 Water Main Break, 1 Power Outage, 1 notification on plane emergency landing on route 80, and 6 weather related. We just started Hurricane Season which runs from June 1st to November 30th. We did receive a dam advisory from United Water for the Hackensack River no incidents occurred.

Sent numerous e-mails to all departments as well as several articles fro the web-site.

Attended numerous meetings for a total of 75 hours on OEM preparedness, emergency medical services as well as JIF safety awards breakfast meeting.

Worked a total of 50 hours in the office reorganizing and filling paperwork. Updating plans.

Spent a total of 166 hours on receiving training and a total of 125 hours on teaching various incident management courses. Total training of 291 Hours from January to June.

Developed a committee from South Hackensack Dept heads regarding the 2013 conversion to narrow-banding radio and licensing.

Attended and set up town hall visit with Memorial School 1stb graders, thanks to all departments who helped.

We have in place a mutual aid agreement with Lodi OEM for assistance during heavy rain storms. We are working with them and supporting a letter to the county on trying to get some type of mitigation grant to redesign the Saddle River Avenue/Marcellus Bridge.

I have been actively involved with the residents and businesses in the Garfield Park section before, during and after a heavy rain.

I have been doing weekly checks of the township all sections as s well as the Saddle River. During storms I frequently check all areas and keep an extra eye on the river. I am part of the New Jersey Emergency Preparedness Association as their volunteer branch director where I deal with over 50 volunteers at different functions during the May conference therefore there is no conference cost to the township.

The following training courses were taken:

Logistic Section Chief five day course Planning Section Chief four day course Resource Unit Leader Course four day course

Attended the following conferences:
Homeland Security Conference in March two day class

New Jersey Emergency Preparedness Conference in Atlantic City 1st week of May, where I attended 4 individual classes on ICS Forms and the Incident Action Plan, Get Ready and Planning for the media and the new Highway Traffic Incident Safety Program where I will be able to teach this session. Met with over 100 vendors and networked with many local, county and state public safety workers.

There are more training courses as well as conference' for the next six months including the league of municipalities that I will be attending. I will also be putting additional tips out on the web-site as well as keeping the committee, department heads and residents informed of any and all preparedness tips and information the best location to get this information is the township web-site.

As you can see Emergency Management is quite busy and getting more and more involved with activities as well as information. We are actively looking for volunteers to help in various jobs. If you are available and can give time please contact me at michaelshoem1@aol.com.

I would like to report on some of our accomplishments for the month of May. Checked & cleaned Grove Street Ejector Station (daily), checked & cleaned Flood Pumps Rt. 46 & Huyler Street (daily), checked & cleaned Ejector Station in Garfield Park (3 times a week), daily check of sewer lines in both sections of town. Cut grass down park, all along Phillips Ave, town hall, firemen's monument, triangle on the bottom of Phillips Ave ramp, around sign on Phillips Ave, and island on Lincoln Street. Spread 3 ½ tons of asphalt on potholes on Louis St and West St. Cleaned up weeds by Green St ditch, and cleaned all monuments for Memorial Day.

For the month of May, the Department Of Public Works had 2 pick up days for newspaper, May 10th and May 24th. On May 10th, the Department Of Public Works used 3 men, 2 trucks, 18 man-hours, 16 gallons of gas, and both trucks rode a total of 107 miles for a total of 6,260 pounds of paper. On the second pick up day, May 24th, the Department used a total of 4 men, 2 trucks, 24 man hours, 16 gallons of gas; both trucks rode a total of 62 miles for a total of 4,820 pounds of paper. 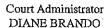
