Cagas motioned; Brugger seconded to make payment in the amount of \$18,351 to M.J. D'Arminio, Inc. for Estimate No. 2. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Brugger, Cagas, Eckel, Regan, Stefano

Committee Reports

Mayor Brugger, Vincent Stefano, Walter Eckel and Frank Cagas thanked Linda LoPiccolo for her dedicated service to the Township. They made several complimentary comments regarding her employment beginning in 1985; congratulated her on her retirement and wished her well.

Mayor Brugger reported that the Township's new solid waste collector began July 1st and that there were several issues but that the Township has addressed those with the contractor and appears that things are going smoother after the second week. Regarding the renovation to Veterans Park, the mayor indicated that there were delays due to weather and that some of the park equipment was not delivered timely.

Bill Regan commended the DPW for coming through during Larry's vacation and maintaining no overtime for the months of May and June. Regan suggested that the Township may want to consider third party billing for the ambulance corps since the cost of supplies is ever increasing. Commended the police department for a successful Click-It or Tick-It campaign for issuing over 60 summonses during the program. He lastly congratulated the Little Ferry South Hackensack Girls District Softball Champions.

Frank Cagas was concerned about losing the COAH funds that the Township has deposited over the years. Mayor Brugger indicated that he intends to meet with the planner and others in the upcoming week to discuss the funds and how to avoid losing those funds to the state. Cagas commented that the Governor's decision not to fund the renovation of the bridge over the Saddle River is a disservice to the taxpayers. Cagas addressed Chief's concern to alleviate storage issue in police department. Cagas spoke with the chief about the vests and guns Frew working on radio problems ESS offered Euclid school in Hasbrouck Heights for a repeater. ESS said better sight in Garfield Park section. Frew reported that the prosecutor's office will permit use of confiscated funds for safety reasons. Regarding vests, some officers complained about their, and have been fitted for a new one. He will be prioritize for additional vests. Received a letter from the Sheriff regarding prioritizing using free labor to the township.

Public Comments

Dolly Montenegro, 57 Phillips Avenue – Congratulated Linda LoPiccolo on her retirement and wished her well. She questioned why John D'Anton would prepare an Agreement and not the municipal attorney. The Mayor replied that because of the pending litigation and the clerk's involvement, it became necessary for Mr. D'Anton to prepare the Agreement. Montenegro suggested that the entire sewer line along Huyler Street be checked for possible issues before there is an issue. Bill Regan indicated that he would follow up. Montenegro agreed with Governor since prior funds of 22 million dollars were not spent as they should have been.

Brian Veprek, Sr., 14 Milano Court – Complained that someone is living in the commercial building at 25 Grove Street and that the other non-compliance issues on that property have not been resolved. Veprek inquired if it was illegal to park vehicles on the front lawn since he noticed that someone on Phillips Avenue was parking on the lawn. Mayor Brugger asked the

police chief to look into that. Lastly, Veprek inquired as to why the park project is taking so long and who will have to pay to repair the sprinkler system in the park that was damaged during construction. Mayor replied that the township would pay since the dpw superintendent had no drawing or diagram indicating where the sprinkler lines were installed. The Mayor also responded to questions from Veprek regarding why the project took so long to complete.

Jim Anzevino, 91 Phillips Avenue — Supported the decision to have special counsel prepare the clerk's retirement Agreement since the township is involved in litigation that may require the clerk's cooperation. Anzevino commented that the delays in the park project were several but no fault of the mayor and that when complete the park project will be successful. Anzevino lastly congratulated the clerk on her retirement and commended her on her years as the municipal clerk. He thanked her for assisting him while he was a member of the Township Committee and said that she had earned the respect of her colleagues in the county and throughout the state.

Lonnie Bedell, 51 Grove Street - Made several comments regarding ongoing issues at 25 Grove Street. He reported in great detail his experience the first day of the new solid waste hauler.

Brugger motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to close the meeting for public comments.

Closed Session

Brugger motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to go into closed executive session at 7:40 p.m., and to suspend the regular order of business, to discuss those matters listed on the closed session resolution. Minutes of closed session were recorded and will be made available to the public when authorized by the governing body and permitted by law.

Resolution 2012-149 Authorizing Execution Of The Letter To State Senators And Assemblymen In The Action Entitled NJDEP V. Occidental Chemical Corporation, et al.

WHEREAS, certain claims have been asserted against the Township of South Hackensack in the action entitled NJDEP v. Occidental Chemical Corporation, et al., Docket No. ESX-L-9868-05, pending in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Essex County (the "Litigation") regarding alleged environmental contamination at the lower 17 miles of the Passaic River, Newark Bay, the lower

reaches of the Hackensack River, the Arthur Kill, the Kill Van Kull, and into adjacent waters and sediments(the "Newark Bay Complex");

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, the Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the Administrator of the New Jersey Spill Compensation Fund (hereinafter referred to collectively as the "State of New Jersey") commenced the present litigation on or around December 13, 2005, suing defendants, Occidental Chemical Corporation, Tierra Solutions, Inc., Maxus Energy Corporation, Repsol YPF, S.A., YPF, S.A., YPF Holdings, Inc. and CLH Holdings (hereinafter referred to collectively as the "Tierra-Maxus Defendants");

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey's Complaint seeks to recover from the Tierra-Maxus Defendants past and future cleanup and removal costs, as well as unspecified economic damages, punitive damages, damages for alleged "unjust enrichment," penalties and a variety of other forms of relief purportedly arising from the alleged discharges into the Passaic River of 2,3,7,8-tetrachlorodibenzo-p-dioxin (a form of dioxin referred to as "TCDD") and other unspecified "hazardous substances" from a plant that operated at 80 Lister Avenue in Newark, New Jersey for approximately twenty years before the plant was closed in 1969.

WHEREAS, in its Complaint, the State has alleged that as a direct result of the Tierra-Maxus Defendants' intentional releases and discharges into the Passaic River, and the Tierra-Maxus Defendants' subsequent practice of obfuscation and delay for another twenty-plus years, TCDD has migrated throughout Newark Bay Complex;

WHEREAS, on or around February 4, 2009, defendants, Maxus Energy Corporation and Tierra Solutions, Inc. filed a third-party complaint against approximately eighty-five (85) municipalities and public entities including the Township of South Hackensack for contribution towards the cleanup and removal costs that Maxus and Tierra have incurred or will incur in the future relating to the Newark Bay Complex.

WHEREAS, certain Third-Party Defendant municipalities and public entities, including the Township of South Hackensack, are members of a group known as the Municipal Group in the Litigation;

WHEREAS, the Township has incurred and continues to incur significant legal and transactional fees in connection with this Litigation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township of South Hackensack as follows:

1. The Township is hereby authorized and directed to sign the signature pages of the Letter to the its State Senator and Assemblymen, which will be adopted in substantially the form contained in

the draft copy on file, and thereafter immediately transmit the said signature pages to Peter J. King, Esq., Liaison Counsel for the Municipal Group.

2. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Whereas, it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4–12b and designated below:

- (1) Matters Required by Law to be Confidential: Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.
- (2) Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.
- (3) Matters Involving Individual Privacy: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.
- (4) Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.
- [5] Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.
- X (6) Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations or possible violations of the law.

X (7) Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is require in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.

(8) Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.

Personnel - Linda LoPiccolo - terms and conditions of employment

__(9) Matters relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty: Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack assembled in public session on this date, that an Executive Session closed to the public shall be held in the South Hackensack Township Municipal Complex, 227 Phillips Avenue, South Hackensack, New Jersey, for the discussion of matters relating to the specific items designated above.

It is anticipated that the deliberations conducted in closed session may be disclosed to the public upon the determination of the Township Committee that the public interest will no longer be served by such confidentiality.

Attached please find the referenced report for your review. This report provides the budgetary status of each account which comprises the Township of South Hackensack's 2012 Adopted Municipal Budget. Please note that 54% of the year has lapsed. The following budget accounts exceed the budget year percentage lapsed based on miscellaneous expenditures, not funds encumbered or yearly contracts paid:

- Legal Services O/E (excluding Township Attorney) This account requires attention by the Township Committee. An emergency appropriation will most likely be needed in August in order to fund the remaining legal services needed through the end of the fiscal year. As noted on the attached report, the balance of the Legal Services O/E account is \$10,414.94. This expenditure rate is due mostly to the tax appeals process.
- Buildings and Grounds O/E The depletion of this account is due to the repair costs associated with the unanticipated sewer break on Huyler Street.
- Ambulance O/E

It should be noted that the amount of overtime and double overtime for the DPW staff for the months of May and June 2012 totaled \$0.00 (excluding standby time).

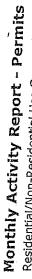

I would like to report on some of our accomplishments for the month of June. Checked & cleaned Grove Street Ejector Station (daily), checked & cleaned Ejector Station in Garfield Park (3 times a week), and a daily check of sewer lines in both sections of town. Cleaned up Town hall, Police station, and Senior's Room. Cut grass at the following locations: park, behind school, along Phillips Ave, Town hall, triangle on the bottom of Phillips Ave ramp, around sign on Phillips Ave, island on Lincoln Street, and Green Street.

For the month of June, the Department Of Public Works had 2 pick up days for newspaper, June 12th & June 26 th. On June 12th, the Department Of Public Works used 4 men, 3 trucks, 24 man-hours, 32 gallons of gas, and three trucks rode a total of 108 miles for a total of 8,360 pounds of paper. On the second pick up day, June 26th, the Department used a total of 2 men, 1 truck, 12 man hours, 16 gallons of gas; both trucks rode a total of 59 miles for a total of 5,900 pounds of paper. For the month of June, the Department Of Public Works picked up a total of 14,260 pounds of paper.

For the month of June, the Department Of Public Works answered 6 ambulances calls. All 6 calls were Medical emergencies. 5 calls were transported to Hackensack Medical Center, and 1 call was transported to Holy name in Teaneck. The total man-hours used for the month of June were 55 hours 10 mins.

The amount available for the Municipal Program will be further sub-allocated into its six (6) Regional Planning Areas. All of these amounts may be adjusted pending the actual amount of open space tax collected.

Project requests and approvals will be made using these newly available funds, as well as supplemental funding from prior project cancellations and withdrawals, should any such funds be available.

Important Deadlines

- Application Deadline for All Trust Fund Program Categories Completed applications, including all required attachments, must be <u>received</u> by the Department of Planning and Economic Development or the Division of Cultural & Historic Affairs by 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 30, 2012. Please follow application instructions.
- Appraisal Reports For open space land acquisition projects, an appraisal is to be conducted in accordance with the Trust Fund appraisal procedure policy statement and must be submitted to the Department of Planning and Economic Development by 4:00 p.m. on Friday, September 28, 2012. The Post Appraisal Project Finance Sheet must be prepared AFTER your appraisal has been completed and submitted to the Department of Planning and Economic Development with your appraisal report(s) by 4:00 p.m. on Friday, September 28, 2012.

Important Information about Appraisals and Funding Amounts for Open Space Land Acquisition

The County of Bergen does <u>not</u> provide 100% of the acquisition cost of the open space property. The County limits its Trust Fund award grant and takes into consideration the availability of any Green Acres' funding. See "Section 9: Trust Fund Award Limits" in <u>The Open Space</u>

RETIREMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN: TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HACKENSACK & LINDA LOPICCOLO

THIS AGREEMENT dated this ______ day of July, 2012 by and between the TOWNSHIP OF SOUTH HACKENSACK, a political and corporate of the State of New Jersey (hereinafter, "the Township") and LINDA LOPICCOLO, whose post office address is 5 North Veprek Lane, South Hackensack New Jersey 07601, (hereinafter, "LoPiccolo").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Linda LoPiccolo, has been employed by the Township of South Hackensack Registrar since 1985 and presently occupies the positions of the Registered Municipal Clerk, Register of Vital Statistics, Qualified Purchasing Agent, Insurance Fund Commissioner, Municipal Housing Liaison, Personnel Officer, Public Agency Compliance Officer, Board of Health Secretary and Storm Water Coordinator; and

WHEREAS, LoPiccolo has accumulated and accrued certain benefits such as sick pay under existing prior practices of the Township; and

WHEREAS, by way of this agreement, the Township and Linda LoPiccolo seek to agree as to the total amounts due to her and how payments shall be made in the best interest of both parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties, based on the premises and terms and conditions herein mentioned, agree as follows:

- 1. The Township of South Hackensack shall pay to LoPiccolo the balance of any unused sick days (95 days) in the amount of \$34,675.00 30 days from the date of adoption of the 2013 Municipal Budget estimated to be May 01, 2013.
- 2. All monies received pursuant to this agreement shall be in lieu of accrued benefits, sick pay, vacation days and compensation time except all monies due and owing to LoPiccolo from vested pension and disability rights as set forth in state statute.
- 3. Upon execution of this agreement, LoPiccolo shall deliver to the Township a fully executed release releasing the Township from any liability arising out of her employment with the Township regarding claims for vacation pay and sick pay, except all monies due and owing to LoPiccolo from vested pension and disability rights as set forth in state statute and payments made pursuant to this agreement.
- 4. LoPiccolo shall be entitled to receive, apart from this agreement, all health benefits and other benefits due her as a result of her years of service

and retirement in accordance with normal Township practices and policies in particular, Chapter 46 - 2 and Chapter 46 - 4, which are incorporated herein by reference

- 5. The Township will continue to indemnify LoPiccolo in accordance with State Law and Township's policies regarding any liability that may accrue to LoPiccolo, which are covered activities under the Township's general liability policy and occurring in the course of her employment with the Township. LoPiccolo agrees if allowed by New Jersey Pension Law to be the Township's QPA without compensation from October 01, 2012 to December 31, 2012. She also agrees to assist the Township or its Special Counsel in defense of any claims against the Township of South Hackensack, particularly Montenegro, et. al. v. Township of South Hackensack (Docket # BER-L-1554-10) currently pending in the Superior Court of New Jersey.
- 6. Any releases delivered by LoPiccolo shall be subject to payment by the Township of monies due LoPiccolo under this agreement.
- 7. The rates of payment as set forth under this agreement are by agreement of the parties vested and shall be payable to the Estate of Linda LoPiccolo if she dies before the payment due under this settlement agreement are, in fact, paid.

8. LoPiccolo shall retire effective September 01, 2012. The parties agree to execute such papers as may be required by the New Jersey Public Employment Retirement Pension System as are necessary to effectuate this retirement.
