Call of Meeting to Order

Mayor Anzevino called the Regular Meeting to order at 7:36 p.m. He advised that pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act Annual Notice of the meetings had been provided to *The Record*, the Herald and News and by posting the Annual Notice on the bulletin board in the clerk's office where notices are customarily posted. Everyone saluted the flag. The municipal clerk called the roll.

Correspondence & Reports

Anzevino motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept correspondence dated September 13, 2010, from Vincent Graziano, 9 Sievers Lane, South Hackensack, NJ Re: sidewalk hazard and move the matter to New Business for discussion.

Anzevino motioned; Maceri seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept correspondence dated October 5, 2010, from Lawrence J. Paladino Re: 9 Sievers Lane and move it to New Business. The Mayor instructed Mr. Paladino to update the list of sidewalk repairs that are needed and submit to the Township Committee.

Anzevino motioned; Maceri seconded and the Committee unanimously September 15, 2010, Kelly Maher, 6 Tuve Lane Re: Resignation as Recreation Commissioner effective immediately.

Brugger motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept correspondence dated September 16, 2010, from Lawrence J. Paladino Re: 56 Dyer Avenue, Dead Tree and move the matter to New Business for discussion.

Anzevino motioned; Eckel seconded and the Committee unanimously agreed to accept correspondence dated September 27, 2010, from John L. Schettino, Esq., planning board attorney Re: Condemi Motor Co. Mayor Anzevino advised that he is happy to receive the grant award notification and has forwarded it and related information to Special Counsel Brian Giblin for his review and comments.

Old Business

Recycling Bid Specification

There was a lengthy discussion regarding the preparation of the recycling bid specifications. Various options were discussed including single stream collection that would exclude for the present time appliances and electronics and yard waste. The attorney will prepare the bid spec with options for ownership of the recyclable material as well as non-ownership of the material. Nasta advised that the current recycling ordinance will require an amendment which he will prepare and circulate to the committee for their consideration.

Personnel Manual – Ordinance Amendments (Repeal Sexual Harassment, Amend to include job titles not in the Code)

Mayor Anzevino and Committee member Brugger requested that the matter be referred to the appropriate sub-committee for review and requested more information from Mr. Nasta who prepared it. The matter will be re-listed for further discussion on November 4, 2010. Nasta reported that there are issues with the recreation ordinance and an ordinance that would regular the ambulance corps since there are mechanism problems that must be corrected by ordinance.

New Business

Sustainable Jersey Certification

The clerk advised that one of the items on the Governor's best practices checklist was attaining certification as a sustainable jersey municipality. The Committee indicated that they would be interested in participating and perhaps attaining certified status. The clerk was directed to prepare the required resolution for consideration by the township committee at the next regular meeting.

Mr. Nasta will draft a letter for signature by Mayor Anzevino. He thanked the fire department and its members for converting the old fire truck into a rescue truck stating that it will save the township money and put the old truck to good use.

WHEREAS the Bergen County Open Space, Recreation, Farmland & Historic Preservation Trust Fund ("County Trust Fund"), provides matching grants to municipal governments and to nonprofit organizations for assistance in the development or redevelopment of municipal recreation facilities; and

A Resolution Providing for a Meeting Not Open to the Public in Accordance with the Provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4–12.

Whereas, the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack is subject to certain requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6, et seq., and

Whereas, the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4–12, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution, and

Whereas, it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4–12b and designated below:

- (1) Matters Required by Law to be Confidential: Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.
- (2) Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.
- (3) Matters Involving Individual Privacy: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual unless the individual concerned (or in the case of progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.
- (4) Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.
- (5) Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.

- (6) Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.
- X_ (7) Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is require in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.

- _____(8) Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.
- _(9) Matters relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty: Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of South Hackensack assembled in public session on this date, that an Executive Session closed to the public shall be held in the South Hackensack Township Municipal Complex, 227 Phillips Avenue, South Hackensack, New Jersey, for the discussion of matters relating to the specific items designated above.

It is anticipated that the deliberations conducted in closed session may be disclosed to the public upon the determination of the Township Committee that the public interest will no longer be served by such confidentiality.

South Hackensack Township Committee Re: Recreation Commission

With sincere regret I would like to offer you my resignation as Chairperson of The South Hackensack Recreation Commission.

I feel that over the last few months the way the Recreation Commission is being administered by the Township Committee has changed to a point that I no longer feel comfortable being a part of. When I was appointed to this Commission it was with the understanding that the Commission would be it's own entity and that the Township Committee's role would be to advise and give suggestions. However recently that has changed.

During the July Recreation meeting the Commission voted to postpone Field Day from September to the spring. This decision was affected by many factors. One of the most pressing reason we, as a Commission, were in favor of postponing was the matter of town finances. The Township Committee has been telling all department heads, as well as the public, that South Hackensack is facing a severe fiscal crisis. The police department laid off two officers and a full time dispatcher, the DPW laid off an employee, and the school has laid off employees and made tremendous cuts. We as a Commission felt that it was not fiscally responsible or appropriate to host a Field Day at this time. It was put to a vote and passed that we postpone until spring when South Hackensack as a whole may be in a better financial position.

There were other factors involved in this decision and I could go on in greater detail, however I feel that action was taken and should be supported by the Township Committee. We as Commissioners were appointed by the Committee to run Recreation and should be allowed to do so as we see fit. At the August Recreation meeting the Mayor informed Recreation that the Township Committee did not accept our decision to postpone. The Mayor also decided that Recreation is to take part in the newly named Family Fun Day in September. Which is the same as having a Field Day.

I feel that if the Mayor and Council want to dictate Recreation to the point of overruling Commission action then they should think about abolishing the Commission all together.

Please see the attached Memorandum from the Mayor to all department heads in reference to spending.

Also, I request that my resignation letter be read at the next Township Committee meeting during the review of correspondence.

On Tuesday; September 28, 2010; DPW Workers Joseph Marrella and Angelo Sortino came into my office to report that their ambulance pagers are not working properly. 
